Departments were given some targets & suggestions

Publications from B.Tech Projects

Major Projects – 50% of No of batches (at least);
Mini Projects & EPICS – 25% of No of batches
(at least);

Publications from PG Projects

M.Tech projects – 80% of students
MCA Projects - At least 50% of students
MBA Projects - At least 50% of students

- Identification of active students for doing Innovative projects / patents and their Encourage with financial support.
- Conducting capacity building programs / Idea churning sessions by experts.
- *Mechanism:* Submission of DPP along its possibility of publication, prior to the semester, to the PRC.
- *Assessment:* Meticulous examination of all students of batches on the progress & possibility of publication
- *Corrective Measures:* Project Guides, who failed to publish min. two out of four projects- identify the reasons for failure and finding ways for improvement.

Academic Calendar:

- Basic and key Academic activities of Institution.
- Example: Commencement of Academic year/ Semester, class work, holidays, Exam schedule & Closing of Semester / Academic year.

1. Implementation of Activity Calendar in addition to Academic Calendar

Activity Calendar - Significance:

- Responsibilities of HEIs and their faculty in changing Educational scenario;
Accreditations (NAAC, NBA, etc.) and Rankings (NIRF, ARIIA, etc.) - Documentation of several activities with evidences and outcomes.
- Therefore, there is a chance of overlooking the activities or not performing them in scheduled time, by several reasons.
- Example: 1.Course end feedback... busy with their exams, corrections of answer scripts, uploading marks,.....
2.Quarterly review of Strategic plan outcomes at dept level.....**effects the quality of outcome**
- Putting all such activities, categorically, month wise, before you in a Calendar - **Activity Calendar**

2. Institutionalization of R&D Excellence Award

Recognition - significance

- Everybody wants recognition for their presence / work – even a just born baby through its first cry
- Recognition / appreciation is a proven & powerful tool for increasing one's participation.
- It motivates coworkers too to work better, thus helps to enhance the performance of Institution

IQAC strongly believes that **“R & D Excellence Award”** improves Research culture in VRSEC.

B) Issues open for discussion.

2. Institutionalization of R&D Excellence Award

Proposed Guidelines - Common Criteria

- 1. One award for each category - Asst. Professors, Assoc. Professors and Professors.**

- 2. Last three years data is considered for award**
- 3. Min total score of overall PBAS – 80% for all category of faculty**
- 4. Prize money will be equally distributed, if more than one faculty are eligible in a category.**
- 5. Prize money for Professors - Rs 30,000/-, Assoc. Professors - Rs 25,000/- and Asst. Professors - 20,000/- and garlanding with a memento**
- 6. The awardees may be felicitated with prize money on the Innovation day / any other day decided by the head of the Institution, every year.**

2. Institutionalization of R&D Excellence Award

Proposed Guidelines - Professors

1. **Min score in R&D of PBAS (3 A) – 90%** (Avg of three years)
2. **Min three Publications in SCI / SCIE (Q1 or Q2 free Journals) over three years**
(The author must be at 1st position in the case of faculty involvement or max 2nd position in the case of M.Tech student project)
3. **Min author h- index (Scopus) as on assessment date - 12.**
4. **Min Rs 20 Lakhs worth of Research funding project (as PI) from Govt. / Non-Govt. agencies over three years under consideration.**
5. **Min one Indian patent – granted, over three years under consideration.**
6. **Min Two Innovative product developments – recognised (1st or 2nd Prize) in IITs / Institutions with NIRF less than 100 / Govt. Organisations.**

OR

Two Scopus publications in free journals from B.Tech Student projects .
7. **Participation in the Foreign University conferences through sponsorship by recognized bodies.**

OR

Registered Start-up with a financial turnover not less than 2 Lakhs / seed fund received from any Govt agency for incubation or product development.

2. Institutionalization of R&D Excellence Award

Proposed Guidelines - Asso. Professors

1. **Min score in R&D of PBAS (3 A) – 90%** (Avg of three years)
2. **Min three Publications in SCI / SCIE (Q1 or Q2 free Journals) over three years**
(The author must be at 1st position in the case of faculty involvement or max 2nd position in the case of M.Tech student project)
3. **Min author h- index (Scopus) as on assessment date- 10.**
4. **Min Rs 10 - 20 Lakhs worth of Research funding project (as PI) from Govt. / Non-Govt. agencies, over three years under consideration.**
5. **Min one Indian patent – Published / Granted over three years under consideration.**
6. **Min Two Innovative product developments – recognised (1st or 2nd Prize) in IITs / Institutions with NIRF less than 100 / Govt. Organisations.**

OR

Two Scopus publications in free journals from B.Tech Student projects.

8. **Participation in the Foreign University conferences through sponsorship by recognized bodies.**

OR

Registered Start-up with a financial turnover not less than 2 Lakhs / seed fund received from any Govt agency for incubation or product development.

2. Institutionalization of R&D Excellence Award

Proposed Guidelines - Asst. Professors

1. Faculty members should possess PhD qualification.
2. Min score in R&D of PBAS (3A) – 80%
3. Min two Publications in SCI / SCIE (Q1 or Q2 free Journals) over three years
(The author must be at 1st position in the case of faculty involvement or max 2nd position in the case of M.Tech student project)
4. Min author h- index (Scopus) as on assessment date - 8.
5. Min Rs 5 Lakhs worth of Research funding project (as PI) from Govt. / Non-Govt. agencies, over three years under consideration.
6. Min one Indian patent – Published / Granted over three years under consideration.
7. Min Two Innovative product developments – recognised (1st or 2nd Prize) in IITs / Institutions with NIRF less than 100 / Govt. Organisations.
OR
Two Scopus publications in free journals from B.Tech Student projects. / from faculty
8. Participation in the Foreign University conferences through sponsorship by recognized bodies.
OR
Registered Start-up with a financial turnover about 2 Lakhs / Seed fund received from any Govt agency for incubation or product development.

2. Institutionalization of R&D Excellence Award

Proposed Guidelines – General guidelines

- 1. The awards are to be initiated one year after announcement & dissemination.***
- 2. There must be a proper communication at the beginning of academic year to all the Faculty, so that everybody should aware of the rules of award / recognition.***
- 3. The finalization of the score for the recognition is judged by a committee headed by the Principal.***
- 4. Publications conversion: One SCI / SCIE = Two Scopus in Q1 / Q2 free journals, if necessary.***
- 5. Publications should remain in Scopus data base for all the years under consideration.***
- 6. Relaxation may be given from either 7th or 8th item for Physics, Chemistry, maths & English depts, provided they have to balance them with appropriate no of additional publications.***
